Welcome to the first TheraP newsletter

TheraP opened its first site, Peter MacCallum Cancer Centre on 29 January 2018, followed by Royal Brisbane and Women's Hospital in February, St Vincent's Hospital Sydney in March and Moorabbin of Monash Health in April. Another six sites are completing activation and local approval processes and are expected to open in the coming months. Peter MacCallum were first to recruit, with St Vincent's and Royal Brisbane and Women's hospitals close behind. Congratulations to teams at these sites for the great start to recruitment!

Patient registration and randomisation process

The TheraP patient enrolment process commences with patient registration in InForm, which should be performed only following informed consent. An email will immediately confirm whether registration has been completed. Completion of InForm registration will trigger the addition of the patient in the WIDEN system, enabling nuclear medicine staff to upload FDG-PET and Ga-PSMA PET scans. These scans will then be reviewed and the result of this review (eligible or not eligible) will be provided by email to site staff.

If the WIDEN email confirms the patient MEETS the inclusion criteria then you can proceed with randomisation in InForm, ensuring the patient ID and date of birth correspond. You will need to enter the 'Number of disease sites' from the WIDEN email into the RANDDETAILS form in InForm.

If the WIDEN email states that the patient DOESN'T MEET the inclusion criteria then DO NOT proceed with randomisation. Please enter the reason for ineligibility in the RANDDETAILS form in InForm, ensuring that the patient ID and date of birth correspond with the email. The reason for ineligibility is included in the WIDEN email. Please refer to the eCRF Completion Guidelines (v1.2) for full details.


