ANZUP achieves its goals by:


- Identifying research questions that health professionals believe will make a difference to the lives of patients and future generations.


How clinical trials work

Pilot studies, phases one and two

Pilot studies are used to test the logic, feasibility and safety of a theory prior to a full-scale trial and can enhance the likelihood of success of the full trial. The early studies, called phase one and two, test the treatment's safety in a small group of people. This means ascertaining that the new treatment has acceptable side effects.

Phases three and four

Phases three and four are much larger studies and test whether the treatment actually works or is effective for its intended purpose. It is also assessed for whether it is beneficial to patients compared with the standard or current treatments for that condition.
